The head of Digital Bridge Institute, Kano led a delegation of the campus on a courtesy call to the executive chairman of Kumbotso Local Government Area Hon. Hassan Garba Farawa on Tuesday, June 2, 2021. The Visit which took place in the Chairman's office at the Local Government Secretariat, was part of the Campus commitment to establish relationship and collaboration with key stakeholders in order to increase the state's exposure in digital skills. In his opening remarks, the Head of DBI Kano, Mr. Sani Tsoho Yakawada noted that the lack of digital exposure as a major factor contributing to the rising rate of youth unemployment. The head of campus observed the achievement of the LGA's administration in youth education, empowerment and job creation, and sought the collaboration of the administration to train the youth of the constituency on vocational training in Digital Technology.

Mr. Yakawada further disclosed that the move is in line with the goals of the Digital Bridge Institute (DBI), an initiative of the Nigerian Communication Commission (NCC) established with a mandate to contribute to the creation of an indigenous ICT knowledge-based society sufficient to meet the needs of the private and public sectors of the Nation's economy. While citing Digital Technology as a driving force for efficient service delivery and facilitation of a sustainable socio-economic growth in the world, Mr. Yakawada also noted that the prospects of the proposed vocational training in digital technology is wide as it will help develop the state's capacity in ICT, contribute to the (digital) economic development of the state through poverty alleviation, job creation, income generation and it will further help in eradicating social vices.

While presenting the training portfolio and proposal, the head of DBI Kano further disclosed that DBI programmes specially designed to take the youth on a journey into the exciting world of technology and innovation, relying on a hands-on practically inclined curriculum that will mold the participants in character and groom them with entrepreneurial skills that will make them potential job creators. In part, the executive chairman of the LGA, while receiving the delegation thanked the Institute for its worthy recognition of his administration and commended the Institute for its notable efforts in promoting Digital skill in the state and the nation by extension. "It is indeed the goal of my administration to see to the education of our youth and the empowerment of our indigenes as we currently have individuals and students on the LGAs empowerment scheme as well as scholarship in various institute of learning" said the Chairman. The DBI team met with the Academic team of the Bayero University to discuss the modalities for the commencement of selected post graduate courses between the Digital Bridge Institute DBI and Bayero University Kano BUK.

The Dean, faculty of Computer Science and Information Technology, Professor Ibrahim Yusuf welcome the DBI team. He stated that, Bayero University, Kano (BUK) is excited at the opportunity of collaborating with Digital Bridge Institute (DBI) on the post graduate programme and believes with careful planning and implementation the proposed collaboration would yield mutual benefits for both parties. However, the institute should put in place a strategic plan for the development of Staff to the doctoral level so that they can support the academic programme and the collaboration with universities.

As it standards currently, there would be disproportionate faculty members ratios between DBI and BUK when the Post Graduate programmes kicks-off. It was resolved that, the institute should finance a one-week joint academic retreat committee to deliberate on the development of a critique and formalisation of the Benchmark Minimum Academic Standard (BMAS) and all basic Curriculum for the programmes.

The Director of Academic Planning stated that, the retreat is important because the Academic Planning Committee (APC) meets only once a year and the next meeting for the committee will be in October 2021. Thus, all documents should be ready early enough for presentation and must go through the laid down process for enacting new courses. The team also met with the vice-chancellor and other principal officers of the University.

The vice chancellor of BUK said he looks foward to such pursues collaboration with an organisation such as DBI for an Automation of universuty processes, Expansion of the University reach and brand. And also the offering of new courses. He further welcome DBI and said he looks foward to a functionally and mutually beneficial collaboration which may include a situation where DBI staff will undertake master's and phD programmes in the university.
