

### THE OFFICE OF THE HEAD OF SERVICE OF THE FEDERATION (OHCSF) SET TO CONSIDER THE NATIONAL INNOVATION DIPLOMA (NID) QUALIFICATION IN THE NATION'S SCHEME OF SERVICE

A technical team from the Office of the Head of Civil Service of the Federation (OHCSF) in conjunction with the Office of Head of Civil Service (OHCS) Kano State, paid an inspection visit to the Digital Bridge Institute, Kano on Monday, September 6, 2021. The visit is as a result of the incessant requests/calls from stakeholders over the years for the inclusion of the NID qualification in the Schemes of Service. Recall that the National Innovation Diploma qualification though approved by the Federal Ministry of Education through the National Board for Technical Education is yet to be officially adopted and included into the Scheme of Service of the Federation. The technical team were tasked to inspect the IEIs vis - a - vis their regulations and academic activities. Six (6) number of IEIs (among which is the DBI Kano) were selected to represent all the IEIs of the federation in this exercise. While receiving the delegation, the Head of DBI Kano, Malam Sani Tsoho Yakawada disclosed that "The National Innovation Diploma (NID) is an initiative of the Federal Ministry of Education through the National Board for Technical Education (NBTE)."

"The NID programme is not only aimed at providing alternative route to Higher Education but also to fill the gap and to supply the technical manpower that is increasingly demanded by the various sectors of the economy, which hitherto, our institutions could not supply due to their low carrying capacity". Mr. Yakawada added. Having been designed to produce graduates with high academic standard and adequate practical background for self-employment as well as being of immediate value to industry and the community in general, the Head of Campus further stated that "the Institute NID programme relies on an up - to date hands – on practically oriented technical curriculum to teach relevant technical knowledge and skills pertinent to the needs of employers in the labor market" "To this end, the programme has nurtured individuals towards obtaining a comprehensive knowledge of their profession and developing a high level of sensitivity, tolerance, inventiveness, confidence in workplace environment, and entrepreneurship skill which is required to face the challenges of human capital resource development in Nigeria, Africa and the World by extension" In addition to the Technical team from the OHCSF, the inspection visit saw in attendance, a permanent secretary from the office of the head of civil service of Kano state and directors from various ministries across the state. While thanking the delegation and extending the Institute's appreciation to the Heads of Civil Service in the State and the federation, the Head of DBI, Kano closed by prayed that the NID certificated be considered for adoption and inclusion in the scheme of service. The delegation in their remarks, observed that the Institute



represented the IEIs commendably and did not betray their positive expectations. They further expressed their satisfaction in the DBI teaching facilities, faculty and commended the Institute for providing such a vast and serene environment for learning.



# CAPACITY BUILDING: DBI PARTNERS NLC TO TRAIN LABOUR LEADERS, AFFILIATE UNIONS IN DIGITAL/ICT. AS DBI PRESIDENT PAYS NLC A COURTESY VISIT

A strategic move to train the leadership of Nigeria Labour Congress (NLC), its affiliate unions and members of trade unions across the country has commenced with a partnership between the Digital Bridge Institute (DBI), Nigeria's foremost International Centre of Excellence in Information and Communications Technology (ICT) training and education, and the NLC. The partnership was cemented when the President of DBI, paid a courtesy visit to the President of NLC, Comrade Ayuba Wabba, at the Pascal Bafyau Labour House, Abuja. The President/CEO of DBI, Prof. Mohammed Ajiya, commended the NLC, especially its President, Comrade Wabba, for its efforts at improving the working condition of Nigeria workers, and also ensure that they are trained to fit in, into the emerging worlds of work driven by ICT. Specifically, Prof. Ajiya applauded the leadership quality of Comrade Wabba, for placing Nigeria name at the global stage due to his emergence as the Global President of International Trade Union Confederation (ITUC), representing 200 million workers across the world with 332 national affiliates. The DBI President, who was represented by the Head, Business Development and Client Services, DBI, Mrs Ngozi Nwoche, informed the NLC leadership that the DBI was established in 2004 by the Nigerian Communications Commission (NCC) and charged with "building human capacity in the ICT/ Telecommunications sector," after exponential growth within the sector created a shortage of suitably qualified and trained human resources. On the capacity of DBI, he pointed out that the institute has capacity to train professionals and people from all sectors of the economy and at all cadre and level, adding that DBI has operational centers in Abuja, with campuses in Lagos and Kano, with two campuses currently under development in Enugu and Asaba. Prof. Ajiya said: "In addition to DBI's mandate to build capacity within the ICT sector, the Institute is also charged with building ICT capacity and digital literacy within all sectors in the nation. Today, DBI is the foremost government-affiliated training and human capacity development organization in ICT in Nigeria, training more than 14,000 participants every year. "During the 8th Regular meeting of the National Council on Communication and Digital Economy NCCDE) held in Owerri from 27th November to 2nd December 2020, the Council approved that Digital Bridge Institute should be the de facto ICT Training Institute for all Ministries Departments and Agencies (MDAs). "Digital Bridge Institute offers IC3 Digital Literacy Certification, is fully accredited by the Centre for Management Development (CMD) and is a leading ICDL Accredited Training and Testing Centre in Nigeria." Responding, Comrade Wabba commended the DBI leadership, led by Prof. Ajiya first for the visit to NLC, and his foresight in believing that the NLC and the Nigerian workers are very relevant on the issue of national development and growth

The NLC president stated that access to ICT in Nigeria is still limited as people are not fully aware of the need to acquire the required skills for the fast emerging worlds of work. He added that there are a lot of job opportunities but unfortunately, the required skills are not there for majority of Nigerians. According to Wabba, there is the need for the digitalization of the entire economy, but the skill required to achieve this is presently limited. He, therefore, charged the DBI to engaged in wide publicity to ensure that Nigerians, especially those in the private sector of the economy key into their training. He pointed out that he brought Medical and Health Workers Union of Nigeria (MHWUN), for a training at DBI when he was the union's National President some years ago, adding, "that was the first time I see such facilities you have in DBI, and such level of human resources at your institute." The NLC President said a committee comprising the experts from the DBI and the NLC would be set up immediately to design the best training modules for the leadership of the congress and also the affiliate unions. Comrade Wabba said: "We can do a packaging and encourage those unions to also utilize this wonderful opportunity. We also have membership across the states, and at the zonal level we can begin to encourage our states to be able to key into it. We can then look at the package and we will identify four persons, we will have a team of small committee to go and interact with you, identify the needs of our unions and the needs of our people here and the various package we can put together. The we can have a seamless process of these training modules." He also advised, "may be you need to do more of public enlightenment, may be those bigger government agencies are aware but we have a lot of opportunity out there ... Even with the Organized Private Sector, NECA, because I know that a lot of IT issues are coming up now." Also speaking, the NLC Acting General Secretary, Comrade Ismail Bello, said: "It is heartwarming that DBI is present in the six geo-political zones. Two years ago, we set up an in-house Future of Work Group in that area and we have been brainstorming, if not for the setback we have with COVID. The Congress president has been keen in empowering our affiliates and ensuring that we embrace the digital platform in our training, in our meetings, and to be ICT driven. "First, we want to upgrade our infrastructure to be able to build the capacity of our people, and we are already thinking on how do we look at bigger states like Kano, like Lagos as hubs for training to ensure that all our affiliates have that opportunity. So, I think it is something that our people will find very useful. "We will form a committee, to focus on the future of works, we will make arrangements on how to start the process. We can come up with a package to start the process and fast track it." End
